Dear Counselors/Advisors,

We would like to invite your rural high school students (current sophomores and juniors) to apply to the Colorado Rural Health Scholars Program.

The enclosed information sheet should give you a feel for the nature of our program. In brief, we are a non-profit group sponsored by the University of Colorado School of Medicine and University Hospital. All students receive a full scholarship for tuition and room and board so that participation is free of charge and the program pays all student expenses. Students are exposed to science and health careers through instruction, taught by University of Colorado Health Science Center faculty and medical students, laboratories, volunteer experience at a local hospital, mentors, and group activities. We also expose the students to the process of applying to colleges and develop their note taking, writing, and public speaking skills.

The student to staff ratio is approximately 2:1 with eight medical students who live with students in the dorms and act as counselors. Thus, every participant is ensured individualized instruction. The 3-week program runs from Sunday, June 8<sup>th</sup> 2014 - Saturday, June 28<sup>th</sup> 2014, and will be an intense educational experience. The students also receive the added benefit of living in a college dormitory at a local university.

When encouraging students to apply for the program, please remember that we are looking for mature, enthusiastic, and motivated students who are willing to work hard and who would benefit from this type of educational experience. This does not necessarily mean only top academic students will be selected. All applicants are evaluated on an individual basis with special attention given to minority status as well as family and economic situations. Forty final applicants will be interviewed by phone before final selections are made, with twenty students being invited to participate. Remind students that materials are to be postmarked or emailed **no later than Friday, March 28<sup>th</sup>**, 2014.

There is no limit to the number of students that can apply from your school.
